French Attache Told to Get Out of Hungary

BUDAPEST, Hungary, June 7. (AP) Col. Georges Lannieren, French military attache here, has been ordered to leave Hungary, French legion sources announced.

No reason was given by the Communist government for declaring him persona non grata.

Vietnam Plans Curb of Red Underground

SAIGON, Vietnam, Indochina, June 7. (AP) The French-sponsored Bao Dai government is preparing new authoritarian controls to curb widespread Communist underground activity, it was reliably reported today.

Official sources said the Vietnamese government is ready to proclaim emergency decrees permitting internment without trial of persons charged with subversive political activity. Under these decrees the government will be empowered to commit such persons to concentration camps by executive order.

Psychiatrists and public health physicians from all states west of South Dakota and Texas will attend, said Dr. C. H. Hardin, Branch, University of Utah psychiatry department head.
