Allow us one more timeworn cliche, if you will the one about a "stitch in time. saves nine."

True it is that we live in a manana sphere; true also that we're the lucky semi-tropical dwellers who don't have to plan ahead toward a brutally cold winter season.

However, summertime is as good a time as any to see to home repairs. Particularly at this crucial point it might be well to check over your home from stem to stern, inasmuch as the time may arrive when lumber and labor for the homestead will fall in the non-essential category.

•It's been pointed out that

run-down homes, disorder and improper equipment were the prime mechanical forces that accounted for the 20,500 killed and 4,500,000 injured in home accidents last year, according to national (and ominous) statistics. Falls, burns, explosions and fires-common to over-age homes in need of repair or modernization were the most frequent types of accidents. It is well, instance, to use the summer months when heating systems are inactive, to check, repair and condition furnaces, chimneys and flues.

If a general check convinces you that your home is in reasonably good order, ferret out the minor repairs you've neglected before. There's that leaky faucet-nothing of major importance but enough to

waste water and be a definite annoyance.

However, the steps ARE weakened from hard usage and who knows? They might crash under heel, causing injury, at a time when you can least afford to be laid low in the hospital, immobilized. fuming-and it would serve

you right. If there are definitely no jobs requiring carpenter, piumber or electrician's services, consider the state of your store rooms and garages. Remember that old rags lying about in the garage are inherently dangerous; old papers and magazines are not only potential fire-feeders but awfully messy as well. If there are any extra young creatures running wild about the house. fired with fruitless activity, this would be a nice summer project for them. Further, if you can really get them to do it, it's a fair-sized project for you and this column would appreciate advice as to how you

This is the time, too, for checking of screens (if you didn't do it early in the spring. as many do). Look for tree limbs that may be hanging menacingly over live wires.
