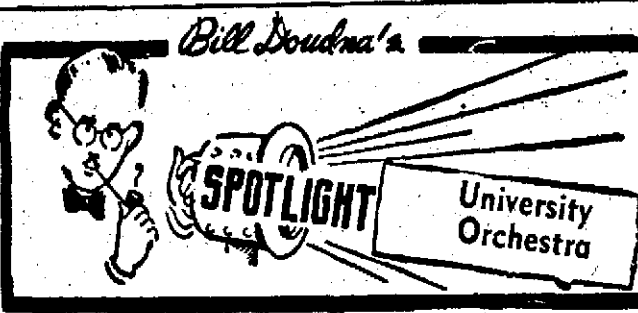

Despite Rains, Crop Harvesting Proceeds Rapidly

Despite heavy rains over much of the state last week, resulting in crop damage in the Milwaukee area, harvesting of many crops is proceeding rapidly, the state employment service said Wednesday.

Corn detasseling is under way in the Madison area, and the grain with sufficient labor for all agricultural jobs.

The pea pick will be completed this week except in northern districts of the state, with canners reporting a large pack of high quality.

Bean and cucumber pickers are being recruited, but no labor shortages are anticipated. There is adequate labor for the small grain harvest in most areas, and for the harvest of onions in the Kenosha area.

The cherry harvest is reaching its peak demand for family workers and single workers in supervised groups.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — (UP) — The CIO United Auto Workers (UAW) and Allis-Chalmers Wednesday night announced an agreement on a five-year contract providing for 3 cent hourly increases each year at the plant here.

Leaders of Local 1027 said they would recommend acceptance of the contract at a general membership meeting next Sunday.

The contract covers 2,100 workers here and is similar to agreements reached for plants at Pitts- burg, Pa., and Norwood, O.

involved the study and classification of 1,050 works.
"Before prescribing music for a disturbed patient, we must know his social, cultural, racial, family, religious, community, and economic background," he explains. "We must study his personality through his behavior, and delve into his physical, medical, and psychiatric history. We must also know what he likes and dislikes in music, and whether he has musical talent or training."

When Dr. Kenneth Landauer, who directs medical care for the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, heard of Capurso's study, he asked him to put his experience to work in finding musical helps for polio-stricken children.

"One of my cases was Bruce, a four-and-a-half year old boy who lived in a respirator most of the time, and who became so hysterical when removed from it that muscle-strengthening work with him was impossible," Capurso says.

Capurso advised two types of music for Bruce, the inactive to soothe him and the active to induce him to respond physically. The child was soon tossing his little body to and fro to the strains of "Peter and the Wolf," "Cinderella," and "Rusty in Orchestra-ville."

Since he came to Madison, Capurso has had word from his assistant in Syracuse that Bruce is not only singing nursery rhymes and moving his limbs in time to his favorite music but has overcome his fears and is walking with help. His nurse volunteered the information that the music was of paramount importance in his progress.

"Linking music to medicine is not a new concept," Capurso says, "although the relation of the art of music to healing continues to intrigue physicians, musicians, and psychologists. Remember that the Hebrews, Greeks, and Egyptians of ancient times were aware of the beneficial powers of music on the mind and body."
