The change results from all CBS television programs moving to KTLA (Channel 2) from KTTV (Channel 11). This change was made when KTTV became an independent station and is producing many of its own shows.

Station KTLA announced last night that U. S. Sen. Richard Nixon will be a guest of Dick Garton on "Guest Appearances" today at 11 a. m. It was presumed that he would talk on the crime inquiry.

President Truman will be heard on KNX at 10:30 p. m. Tuesday as he gives the address dedicating the cornerstone of the New York Presbyterian Church in Washington, D. C. It will be a rebroadcast of the rites earlier in the day.
