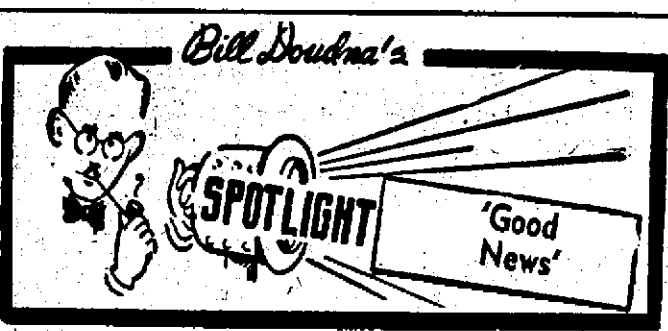

"Good News," now touring Wisconsin, is one of the all-time bests in the history of the University of Wisconsin Haresfoot club. It has energy, and is staged with ball-bearing smoothness.

The musical comedy opened Saturday night before a capacity audience of 1,500 in the auditorium of Janesville high school. Unlike most first nights, this one showed few signs of need for polishing.

The highly receptive audience appeared to love each and every moment, from the precision-model overture and the opening kick-chorus to the flashy finale, which again brought the dancers into the spotlight.

This Broadway hit about college life was made-to-order for the organization. It offered plenty of opportunities for the appearance of the real stars of Haresfoot—the kick-chorus—and for the individual performers to strut their stuff.

When the first-night honors are passed out, a big share must go to E. C. Reynolds, graduate student from Pocatello, Ind., who in his Haresfoot debut came up with a sparkling, stage-wise comedy performance as a miniature football player whose gag topped his bulk.

Bob Hark's singing was another highlight, beating par for the course. He played an all-American prospect who had to hurdle an astronomy exam to appear in the big game of the season. Nuvit Odogru, graduate student from Istanbul, Turkey, did outstanding work in a small part as the astronomy professor.

Bob Couture, law student from Milwaukee, again scored a hit as the man chasing coed, and Tom Milnerich, senior from Milwaukee, was a coy and lovely blonde. Norman Janssen, senior from Combined Locks, was a suitably shy sample of coeducational brain power.
