San Pedro Fish Fiesta Will Be on Video Sunday

HOLLYWOOD, KTLA exclusively will telecast the Fifth Annual San Pedro Fishermen's Fiesta Sunday starting at 11 a. m., continuing for three hours, until 2 p. m. This showing is actually two remote telecasts rolled into one big three-hour event with the opening event being that of the Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving from Mary, Star of the Sea, Church in San Pedro—the fisherman's church.

Here mass will be given along with a narration. The William Ripley Dorr Choir sings.

Starting at approximately 12:15 p. m. the KTLA cameras will cover all of the old world pageantry and pomp of the actual blessing of the fishing fleet, followed by the world's largest boat parade—with 125 boats spectacularly decorated for the gala affair.

Many civic dignitaries are expected to participate in the annual fiesta. Archbishop J. Francis McIntyre will give the actual blessing of the fleet, Lt. Gov. Goodwin Knight, Mayor Fletcher B. Brown, Adm. W. D. Baker—commandant of the 11th Naval District and commander of the Southern California sector of the Western Sea Frontier, are just a few of the guests expected.

The boats are competing for a grand prize of \$5000 which has been offered to the one best decorated.

Twenty-year-old Peggy Kerns will be the "skippette" of the affair, and will appear in a spectacular headdress and gown made entirely of fish net, starfish, shellfish and other symbolic materials. Ten little girls in white will toss flowers into the sea, in memory of the men who have lost their lives at sea during the past year.

The entire telecast will be under the direction of KTLA's sparkplug, Klaus Landsberg, with Dick Lane handling the narration.

Answer to Question No. 1
Yes. Call it something else, such as "Why your kid is sometimes so ornery and other times so good"—anything to fool parents into reading it. Yes, the possible breakdown of our two-party political system.
