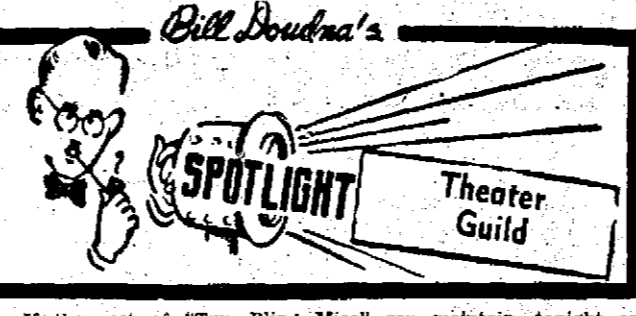

Conferees Agree on Postal Rate Hike

WASHINGTON—(AP)—A bill to raise postal rates about \$117,000,000 a year was agreed on Thursday by a conference committee of senators and representatives.

It would abolish the penny postcard, raising the price to 2 cents, but would retain the present 3-cent rate for ordinary letters.

At the same time the conferees agreed on a 10 per cent pay raise for about 1,500,000 federal employees, limiting the increase, however, to not more than \$800 a year in any case.
