TWO WORKS SELDOM HEARD hereabouts and one which is fairly familiar made up the program which the Pro Arte quartet and two assisting artists gave Friday night at Music hall.

Mrs. Beatrice Bentz Hagen, violist, joined the quartet in Bruckner's "Quintet in F Major," a massive composition of varying vitality.

In each, there was a splendid spirit of ensemble, as there always is in these concerts, Strangely enough, it was best shown in the erratic Krenek work which, musically, was the least satisfying of all.

In spite of all the Pro Arte men put into it, the quartet came out thin and unexciting, except for some flashes of beauty and some snatches of inspiration (especially in the use of the extreme high register of the cello).

The Bruckner quintet also made unusual use of the instrument almost overemphasized segments in which it was accompanying the others.

One must note especially the elegant quality which the musicians gave the adagio movement.

Mrs. Carpenter again became an integral part of the group with her understanding performance in the Faure quartet. Never did she let the piano become either a solo instrument or a mere accompanying one.

This is a melodious work, high in lyricism, and approaching the orchestral in its treatment of climaxes.
