THE long, heavily-loaded cars of the Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey circus will begin arriving in Madison about 4:30 a. m. Sunday, when unloading operations will begin at the Commercial ave. crossing of the Chicago and North Western railroad.

Three sections will make up the circus train, Division S, L. C. Reynolds of the North Western lines said Friday. Arrival will depend largely upon when the show is able to leave Fond du Lac, where it will play today.

The second section should come in about 5:30 a. m. and the third by 6 a. m., Reynolds said.

First acts to arrive will carry the cookhouse—kitchen and dining tents and equipment—and most of the menagerie. Other equipment will fill the second section, while the third will be mainly sleeping cars for performers and executives.

The circus will give two performances Sunday at Triax Field. Doors will open at 1 and 7 p. m. and shows will be at 2:15 and 8:15 p. m. The circus will be sponsored by the Madison Optimist club, with proceeds going to its boys' work fund.

Even before the show is over, workmen will start packing up; the first section is expected to leave Commercial ave. for Beloit about midnight, the last by 1:45 a. m. The circus will give two performances Monday in Beloit.

Almost every display will include newly imported acts, from Oscar Konyot's comedy lions, which open the performance to the Camillo Mayer troupe of high-wire daredevils, which will appear just before the last of the four "spectacles."

Other new acts from abroad include Greta Frisk, Nine Karpowa, and Miss Lulgina, solo aerialists; the Linars, tight-wire artists; the Heltrids, roller skating stars; the Riggetts, the Fens-Perron duo, the Rassos, and the Balancing Bishins, acrobats; Hammerschmidt's Wonder Apes; Dieter Tasso and Helmut Gunther, jugglers; the Ricoris and the Six Frierians, cycling acrobats; the Aerial Montons; the Riding Erzop family, and the Gimmas troupe of acrobatic acts.

MUSIC FROM ISRAEL: Concert audiences in various American cities will be hearing new Israeli music this fall and winter directed by Milton Katims, who has just returned from Israel. There he led the Israeli Philharmonic orchestra in a series of 15 concerts during July and August. He has brought back with him the scores of several works by contemporary Israeli composers he hopes to introduce to the American public. They include a symphony by Ben-Chaim, one of the leading Israeli composers, and an overture by Kaminsky, a member of the Israeli Philharmonic.

In November and December, Katims will be guest conductor of the Buffalo Symphony orchestra for six weeks, directing six concerts in Buffalo and taking the orchestra on tour for 10 concerts in other New York cities and in New England. In January he will conduct two concerts with the Seattle Symphony, and in February two with the Detroit Symphony.

Katims, who first won fame as a violinist, was one of the leading performers at the Casals festival in Prades, France, playing viola in the chamber groups. This winter, when conducting duties permit, he will be violist with the NBC Symphony orchestra on the occasions when Arturo Toscanini conducts.
