Bill Douma's SPOTLIGHT 'Parade' Writers

TIP O' THE MORNING: Brian Aherne returns to the screen in "I Confess" after four years' absence. His last picture was "Juarez."

AUTHORS of a "Parade" magazine article, "Can You Spot a Mad Killer?" will be interviewed by Arthur Van Horn over ABC-WENR at 7:45 tonight.

The article will appear Sunday in The State Journal's "Parade" section. It is a full background report on Bayard Peakes' murder of a 20-year-old secretary at Columbia university, plus a public health doctor's views on how to prevent such crimes.

NEW SEASON: The Philharmonic chorus of Madison will have its first rehearsal with its new director, Bernhard H. Westlund, at 8 p. m. Tuesday in the City YMCA. The season will start the organization's seventh season.

Westlund will hold the first of a series of auditions for prospective new members just before the rehearsal; auditions will begin at 7:30 p. m.

The chorus is an independent, self-supporting, and self-governing organization, drawing its membership from the general public.

MISCELLANY: When the Rideau Players close their Racine season tonight with "Brigadoon," the leading male role will be played by Norman Weltkun, medical student at the University of Wisconsin.

Don Herbert, television's "Mr. Wizard," is touring Europe with his wife. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. H. G. Kemskie, La Crosse.

Paintings by Spanish artists from the middle ages until today will make up a special exhibition which will open Friday in the Milwaukee Art Institute. Called "Five Centuries of Spanish Art," it will be on view through Oct. 25.

Among the contemporary painters represented are Picasso, Gris, Miro, Dal, and Clave. Besides the 62 paintings, there are drawings by Goya, a tapestry, a 13th century professional cross, posters, ceramics, dolls, costumes, and fans from Spain.

FROM WISCONSIN: Nancy Olson, co-starring with John Wayne in "Big Jim McLain" at the Capitol theater, is a native of Milwaukee, the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Henry Olson.

After winning an oratorical contest in which she told children how to bring up their parents, she appeared in a high school play and decided to enter the theater.

Miss Olson attended the University of Wisconsin and Northwestern university, then went to the University of California at Los Angeles, where an aunt and an uncle were on the faculty. As a drama student, she won the attention of a movie talent scout and signed a Hollywood contract.

On March 19, 1950, she married Alan Jay Lerner, composer of "Brigadoon" and "Paint Your Wagon." They have a 10-month-old daughter Liz, and own a 22-acre farm at Pomona, N. Y., whose mansion once was headquarters of Gen. Lafayette.
