Both twins played mighty well. Juliette had less chance to show her ability, since the piano is part of the band in Grainger work, but she gave the part spice and vigor.

The band did famously with the "Chamber of Commerce" and 5:15 Hour News 5:45 Sports; News "Ranch House Party" sections of Gillis' "Portrait of a Frontier Town," handling fanfares, syncopation, and rousing rustic dance beats well. The other movements offered less to the band, but they were satisfactorily played.


