Pres. Fred Riser of the Madison Lions club and **Director Ralph Woodward** of the Drake University choir will speak on WISC at 11:30 a. m. today in connection with the choir's concert here tonight.

PAINTINGS BY COLESCOTT: A New York one-man show

by a University of Wisconsin art education professor, **Warrington Colecott**, has received a whole series of favorable reviews.

The New York Times said: "Warrington Colecott's water-colors at the Serigraph Gallery are a record of a tour in France and Spain. But they are not apt to damage the postcard industry. For he is well over the borderline of realism toward abstraction. Familiar sights lurk, however, beneath his dashing brushstrokes and rapid washes of color. The best of these, Spanish landscapes, have an almost visionary quality."

The New York Herald-Tribune called the exhibit "uncommonly interesting," and added: "He transforms his material into dramatic original, rhythmic, and construction of bristling line and vigorous color that almost but never quite lose touch with visual reality and at the same time project a poetically felt mood."
