Bill Dowd's SPOTLIGHT Rudolf Kolisch

TIP OF THE MORNING: WGN is first in the field with 1953 football information. The station will broadcast 11 games, starting Sept. 26 with Indiana-Ohio State and ending Dec. 5 with Notre Dame-S.M.U.

RUDOLF KOLISCH, leader and first violinist of the Pro Arte quartet, and Allen Willman, chairman of the division of music at the University of Wyoming, are flying to Europe to give 20 "command concerts" for U. S. personnel in Germany.

The men were invited to Europe by the U. S. high commissioner. They will open the series the first week in July. Then Kolisch will spend a week directing the violin class in the Summer Institute of Contemporary Music at Darmstadt before resuming the concerts.

In addition, Kolisch and Willman will give radio concerts at Basle, Salzburg, Innsbruck, Vienna, Baden-Baden, Stuttgart, Munich, Frankfurt, Hamburg, Paris, and London.

This will be Kolisch's first return to Europe in 15 years. Born in Klamm, Austria, he began his studies when he was 6. World War I interrupted his work. After his discharge from the Austrian army, he resumed study and became the composition pupil of Arnold Schoenberg.

Outbreak of World War II found Kolisch in the U. S. with his own quartet, which he had founded in 1922. He became an American citizen and lecturer at the New School for Social Research. He came to the University of Wisconsin in 1944 as an artist in residence. Last year, he shared the Schoenberg medal with Dimitri Mitropoulos and Eduard Steuermann.

Willman was born in Hinkley, Ill. Before going to the Wyoming school in 1936, he studied at Knox college and Chicago Musical college. In 1935, he won the Paderewski prize in composition.
