

Popular Networks Baritone Will Join Pearce Monday

Buddy Clark To Be Guest On Broadcast At 8 P. M.; Mayor Of Frisco Cast As Escort For Cantor

Buddy Clark, well known young network baritone, will join the gang of zanies headed by Al Pearce as a guest singer in the WEAJ broadcast Monday, at 8:00 p. m.

The program will feature "candid camera" self revelations of the Gang's principals, including Arlene Harris, Tizzie Lish, Eb and Zeb Vince Barnett and Carl Hoff.

Hoff and his orchestra will play, among other numbers, "This Is It," from the new Broadway success, "Stars in Your Eyes;" "Gotta Get Some Shut-Eye" and "Honolulu."

Mayor Angelo Rossi, of San Francisco, will personally escort Eddie Cantor and his Caravan troupe from Los Angeles to Frisco this week for the banjo-eyed comedian's broadcast Monday, over WABC at 7:30 p. m. direct from Treasure Island. Bert Parks, the Mad Russian, Sid Fields, Kay St. Germain and Edgar Fairchild's orchestra will also make the trip with Eddie.

The sunny shores of Italy will be the next stop on the Contented Hour's musical tour, when Opal Craven, the Continental Quartet and Marek Weber's orchestra present "Neapolitan Night" during the broadcast over WEAJ Monday, at 10:00 p. m. Miss Craven will sing the popular "Santa Lucia," and Earl Tanner, tenor, will be heard in "O Sole Mio." The quartet will offer "Maid of Surriento" and "L'Addio A'Napoli," and the orchestra will play "Funiculi Funicula," Pestalozzi's "Ciri Biri Bin," and "Arditi's "IIBacio." Weber's violin solo will be "Torna A' Surriento" by Di Curtis.

Margaret Speaks, soprano, will sing the aria "Eblen." Ne Andro Lontana" from Catalani's opera "La Wally" as a highlight of the Voice of Firestone program Monday, at 8:30 p. m., over WEAJ. Other solos by Miss Speaks will be Valverde's "Clavelitos," Schertzinger's "One Night of Love" and La Golondrina." The symphony orchestra, conducted by Alfred Wallenstein, will be heard in the Farandole from Bizet's "L'Arlesienne" suite, Paderewski's "Minuet," and Brahms' Hungarian Dance No. 5.

sents" programs over NBC and CBS.

"There was a time," recalls Green, "when practically every tune out of Tin Pan Alley had the word 'love' in its title. It was considered sacrilegious by the songsmiths to use a title without it, just like it was considered imperative that the words 'June and 'moon' be combined in every song. Now, however, the lyricists seem to have forgotten all about their old standbys and go in for such high falutin' phraseology as 'we were as high as a steeple, but we were intelligent people' or 'small fry hangin' round the poolroom, small fry should be in the schoolroom'."

Green offers the recent list of best sellers in sheet music to back his claim that 'love' is the songtitlists' forgotten word. Out of the fifteen titles listed not one makes mention of that universal feeling.

They are "My Reverie," "All Ashore," "Two Sleepy People," "Heart and Soul," "My Own," "Lambeth Walk," "Alexander's Ragtime Band," "I've Got a Pocketful of Dreams," "The Umbrella Man," "You Must Have Been a Beautiful Baby," "Night Before Christmas," "While a Cigarette Was Burning," "They Say," "Summer Souvenirs" and "What Have You Got That Gets Me."
