

Operatic Star, Film Players Set For Thursday Program

Aherne And Crisp To Chat With Burns; Carmen Miranda, Sensational Brazilian, Booked On Vallee Hour

Susanne Fisher, soprano star of the Metropolitan Opera Company, and Brian Aherne and Donald Crisp, film players, will be guests of Bob Burns, summertime host of the Music Hall, during the broadcast on Thursday, from 9:00 to 10:00 p. m., over WEAf

Aherne and Crisp will chat with Burns, Pat Friday, Ken Carpenter and John Scott Trotter. Mme. Fisher will sing a group of request songs and Pat Friday will be heard in popular hits. Burns' bazooka solo and music by Trotter's orchestra will complete the program.

Carmen Miranda, sensational Brazilian star of the Broadway stage hit, "Streets of Paris," will make a return appearance on the Rudy Vallee Hour, Thursday at 7:00 p. m., over WEAf. Rudy also will present the buffoonery of Bert Lahr, the dialectic tricks of Lou Holtz and the poetic diatribes of Ogden Nash.

Lahr will fly from Hollywood to participate in the hour. Nash will recite some of his popular poems and Holtz, now virtually a Vallee fixture, will be heard in another of his Sam Lapidus yarns. Miss Miranda will sing two numbers, accompanied by six young guitarists.

Sir Adrian Boult, general music director for the BBC, will be guest conductor of the Toronto Promenade Symphony Orchestra during the concert broadcast Thursday, from 8:00 to 9:00 p. m., over WJZ. Grave Panvini, young American soprano, will be the soloist. Sir Adrian will conduct the orchestra in the Introduction and Allegro by Bliss, followed by the Bell Song from Delibes' "Lakme," sung by Miss Panvini. The broadcast portion of the concert in the varsity arena at the University of Toronto will conclude with Haydn's Symphony No. 99, in E. flat Major.
