Marie Wilson Of Hollywood Fame Will Appear  
With Vallee; Toronto Orchestra Director  
To Be Soloist

Bert Lahr, the cowardly lion of the "Wizard of Oz," and George Stone, well known character actor, have been added to the Kraft hall guest list for Thursday at 9 p. m. over WEAf. Bob Burns also will present Mischa and Sandra Levitsky, each individually famous as a concert pianist, in their first radio appearance as a piano team. Pat Friday and John Scott Trotter's orchestra will offer "Start the Day Right," "Dancing In the Dark," "Over the Rainbow" and "Barrell Polka."

Marie Wilson, one of Hollywood's most glamorous screen stars, will be guest of Rudy Vallee during his variety hour on Thursday at 7 p. m. over WEAf. Miss Wilson will be interviewed and will take part in a one-act play. Lou Holtz, comedian, will be back with more stories about "Sam Lapidus."

Elsie Spivak, concertmaster of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, will be guest soloist during the Promenade Symphony Orchestra concert conducted by Reginald Stewart, on Thursday at 8:00 p. m. over WJZ. Spivak will be heard in Paganini's Concerto for Violin and Orchestra, Opus 6, in D major. The broadcast will open with Dukas' "Sorcerer's Apprentice," followed by Hayden's "Serenade for Strings" and Purcell's "The Golden Sonata."

Glen Bainum and his Concert Band will be heard during the broadcast portion of the Grant Park Concert on Thursday at 9:30 p. m. over WJZ. Band arrangements of selected orchestral classics and martial airs will be featured. The broadcast will come from the band shell in Grant Park, Chicago.

It will be up to Ben Bernie to keep his arch enemy, Walter Winchell, in tow Thursday.
