

4-H Scholarship Winners To Be Named On Crosby's Hour

J. L. Kraft Will Welcome Eight Victors; Paulette Goddard Will Be Guest On Walter Huston Program

J. L. Kraft will welcome the eight winners of 4-H Club College scholarships to Bing Crosby's Music Hall on Thursday.

An imposing lineup of visitors consisting of Kirsten Flagstad, leading Metropolitan Opera Company soprano; Sterling Holloway, comedian; and Brian Aherne, actor of stage and screen will take their turns at the NBC red network microphone which will be turned on promptly at 10 p. m.

This is one of the rare appearances of Kraft. His company is the donor of the 4-H Club scholarships.

Consistently a top-draw at the Metropolitan Opera Co. in New York, Kirsten Flagstad, besides being interviewed by Bing, will sing, "Leise Leise," from "Der Freischutz" by Von Weber; "When I Have Sung My Songs," and "Morning" by Olye Speaks III.

The Music Maids and John Scott Trotter's orchestra will background the Crosby tunes which are, "An Apple for the Teacher," "Day In and Day Out," "If I Knew Then," "Over the Rainbow," and for his 1933 Memory song, "Love Is the Sweetest Thing." The Trotter orchestra does a special arrangement of "Prelude in G. Minor," by Rachmaninoff.

Paulette Goddard's guest performance opposite Walter Huston is a radio version of Hallie Flanagan's one-act play, "The Curtain," and the world premiere of Peter de Rose's unnamed concert waltz, will be features of Good News of 1940, Thursday, over WEAJ at 9 p. m.

Fanny Brice in her role as Baby Snooks has cooked up more devilment for daddy, as played by Hanley Stafford. And Walter Huston, as master-of-ceremonies, will also present Roland Young, Connie Boswell, Warren Hall and Meredith Willson's orchestra.

Meredith Willson, convinced that American popular composers have lacked the impetus, but not the necessary ability, to write classical music, has now commissioned De Rose, Sigmund Romberg, Lou Alter, Duke Ellington and Dana Suesse to write original classics for introduction on Good News. De Rose's Concert Waltz will be the first of the compositions to be played.

Connie Boswell will sing "El Rancho Grande" and "The Last Two Weeks In July," Willson's orchestra in contrast to its Concert hall presentation, will play "Jumpin' Jive," a number made popular by Cab Calloway.

A cavalcade of strange motion picture events, including the jinx of "The Big Parade," will be presented by Alois Havrilla, master-of-ceremonies, when he takes his Strange As It Seems program to Hollywood for the broadcast of
