

Beery To Do "The Champ" On Radio Theatre Hour Monday

Popular Actor Will Recreate Famous Role On WABC At 9 P. M.; Templeton Signs Pat O'Malley As A Regular

Wallace Beery recreates one of his most popular movie roles when he plays the title-part in "The Champ" as the Radio Theatre's feature on Monday. With Cecil B. DeMille as producer, "The Champ" will be broadcast over WABC at 9:00 p. m.

Always a popular radio performer, Wallace Beery has received many requests that he once more play the part of the rough, tough but likeable Champ who bums his way thru life with his youngster, Dink, as his only admirer.

Pat O'Malley, British singer and monologist who gave to America the epics, "Anne Boleyn," and "Little Albert the Lion," has been signed as a regular on Alec Templeton Time, presented Mondays at 9:30 p. m., over WEAF.

O'Malley, with Templeton, made his American debut in 1935 with Jack Hylton's troupe. Altho best known for his comic monologues in Lancashire dialect, O'Malley first gained prominence as a singer. Hylton discovered and developed his comic aptitudes and he soon became a favorite with British and continental night clubbers before his initial American appearance four years ago.

For the second concert in his current series Richard Crooks will feature "Lohengrin's Farewell" by Wagner, during the Voice of Firestone, Monday at 8:30 p. m., over WEAF. Crooks also will sing Purcell's "Passing By," Schubert's "Serenade" and will conclude the concert with "Ah, Sweet Mystery of Life" by Victor Herbert. Alfred Wallenstein will conduct the orchestra in the Wolf-Ferrari overture to "Secrets of Susanne." De-Falla's Spanish Dance No. 1 and Gould's "Pavane."

The native songs of Cuba will be featured during the Contented program Monday at 10:00 p. m., EST., over WEAF. "Siboney," will be the opening selection by Joseph A. Pasternack's orchestra, which also will be heard in "La Bomba," Herbert's "Cuban Serenade" and a medley of "Jungle Drums," "La Comparsa" and "Mama Inez," featuring the chorus. Opal Craven's slumber song will be "Nino Querido" and tenor Earle Tanner will sing "Loca Loca." The Continentals Quartet will introduce "The Peanut Vendor."

Basil Rathbone and Nigel Bruce will do "The Lion's Mane," a salt-water thriller, during the Sherlock Holmes program, Monday at 8:00 p. m. over WJZ. The action will center around a man found staggering along a seacoast unable to say anything but "the lion's mane." Rathbone in the role of the indefatigable Holmes will unravel the mystery despite the blunderings of his assistant, Dr. Watson, portrayed by Bruce.

Maestro Andre Kostelanetz and his "Tune-Up Time" cast will be heard in a gala home-coming program, Monday at 8 p. m. over WABC when the group returns to New York after a six week's Hollywood sojourn.

A new arrangement of a South American Conga called "Cui-Cui," will have its first airing on the broadcast. Another orchestral number will be the ever-popular "Blue Skies."
