Florence George And Harry Carey Will Also Be Heard With Crosby; Ask-It-Basket Will Have "Sticklers"

Bob Burns will be welcomed back while Annabella (Mrs. Tyrone Power) will make her debut on Bing Crosby's program Thursday at 10 p. m. over WEAf. The occasion also will mark a reunion of prominent alumni, Florence George and Harry Carey.

Over and above the usual Crosby-Burns interviews there will be such musical hors d'oeuvres as the Musetta Waltz from "La Boheme" and "My Old Kentucky Home," sung by Mrs. George, and a long awaited bazooka solo by virtuoso Burns.

Lou Holtz, whose comic guest appearances in recent months have been an almost weekly procedure, bobs up on Good News of 1940, Thursday at 9 p. m. over WEAf. The broadcast also will feature new mischief by Baby Snooks (Fanny Brice.) and songs by Connie Boswell.

Edward Arnold, jovial master-of-ceremonies, will present the regular Good News performers.
