Screen Guild Theatre To Do "Petrified Forest," With Humphrey Bogart And Great Cast In Supporting Roles

Tyrone Power will return to the air as guest star in Robert Sherwood's "Petrified Forest" on the Screen Guild theatre over WABC Sunday at 7:30 p. m.

Power will be supported by Humphrey Bogart and an all-star Hollywood cast. Roger Pryor will direct the program with Oscar Bradley and his orchestra in charge of music.

"Petrified Forest," a story of romance and gunfire in a desert gas station, was a smash hit on the stage and repeated on the screen.
