

Full Commencement Broadcast Tops WHA Today, Monday

MONTREAL—(U.P.)—Crown Princess Juliana of the Netherlands plans to make a radio address from Montbello, Que., at 2 p. m., CST, Monday.

The broadcast will be over a Canada-wide hookup, and, it was understood, will also be heard in the United States through NBC and CBS.

The princess will speak in both English and French.

The 87th University of Wisconsin commencement program will be aired in its entirety by radio this afternoon and Monday morning. At 4 p. m. today the baccalaureate services will be broadcast from the field house over WHA with Pres. Clarence Addison Dykstra delivering the sermon.

Monday morning, starting at 8:15 over WHA and 10 a. m. over WIBA, the final commencement exercises will be broadcast. A description of the procession will open the WHA broadcast. The state's greetings will be delivered by Gov. Heil and the charge to the graduation class by Pres. Dykstra.
