11:15 a. m., WMAL and WRC—N. B. C.'s observers, including Bauhage, H. V. Kaltenborn, Earl Godwin and Raymond Clapper, gather 'round the Round Table to review what's already happened in Chicago.

11:15 a. m., WOL—The United States Navy Band, Charles Benter, leader, broadcasts its concert from the Washington Navy Yard. Mrs. Arthur M. Gillett, a Washington composer, is represented on the program with her "Farewell," while the other numbers include Goldman's "Cuckoo;" "If I Were King," Adam; "Legionnaires on Parade," Olivadoti; "Uncle Sammy," Holzmann, and "The Glory of the Marines."
