Maryland Farm Group to Broadcast Its Defense Role

A group of farm people from Baltimore county, Md., will discuss the skills of agricultural production in the first program of a new series devoted to agriculture and national defense on the National Farm and Home hour, at 10:30 a. m. Monday over NBC-WIBA-WMAQ.

Speakers who will be heard include Jackie Matthews, member of the Future Farmers of America; Sarah Yoder and Jim Prigel, 4-H club members; Mathilda Lacey, a community homemaker's club leader; Phillip C. Turner, dairy farmer; Mrs. Emory Yoder, farm woman, and E. Ross Pearce, county Agricultural Adjustment Administration official. M. L. Wilson, director of extension work for the United States department of agriculture, also will speak.

The participants will tell how the members of 6,000,000 farm families are trained from childhood to develop the skill necessary to produce crops to fill the nation's bread basket.
