

# Grace Moore Guest Star Of Musical Americana Thursday

Soprano Favorite To Offer Three Melodies; Charles Boyer And Tommy Dorsey Visit Bing Crosby's Music Hall Program

Grace Moore, soprano star of opera, concert, screen and radio, will be guest star on "Musical Americana," Thursday at 10:30 p. m. over WEAF. She will contribute three songs to the program by Raymond Paige and his Westinghouse Radio orchestra. The Norsemen Quartet also will be heard.

Miss Moore will sing one of her favorite songs, "One Night of Love," the aria, "Il Est Doux, Il Est Bon," from Massenet's "Herodiade," and an American classic, "Jennie With the Light Brown Hair," by Stephen Foster.

Charles Boyer, Tommy Dorsey, and radio comedienne Mineeva Pious, make up the guest panel in Bing Crosby's Music Hall for the Thursday get-together. Also on hand for Thanksgiving No. 2 will be Bob Burns, Connie Boswell, the Music Maids and John Scott Trotter's orchestra.

New to the proceedings is Charles Boyer, who has never faced Bing Crosby across WEAF microphone that will carry his verbal foray at 9 p. m. Minerva Pious, who is an old friend of Fred Allen's, will also be making her debut on the program.
