

Cantata, Walt Whitman, and Tonight

Edgar A. Guest, taking over the reins of "We The People" as guest host, will present a patriotic cantata, "I Hear America Singing," based on the poetic works of Walt Whitman, tonight at 7 through WBBM. "I Hear America Singing" was written by George Kleinsinger, who will appear on the program to tell his own remarkable story. He started reading the works of Whitman in a CCC camp and was inspired to study music so he could write the cantata. All the lyrics are taken from Whitman poems.
