Pope Pius Speaks

His Holiness Pope Pius XII will discuss "The Soviet in the War" during a worldwide broadcast Sunday, from Vatican City. The talk will be heard over WIBA, WBBM, and WMAQ, at 4:30 a. m.

Vice-President Wallace, Rep. Sam Rayburn (D., Tex.), Sen. Arthur Capper (R., Kan.), Rep. John W. McCormack (D., Mass.), Rep. Daniel A. Reed (D., N. Y.), Col. William J. Donovan, and Prof. T. V. Smith, former Illinois congressman, will speak on the air tonight.

In a talk at 6:30 through WBBM, Donovan will discuss Hitler's psychological attacks on his enemies. Wallace and the four congressmen will participate in a roundtable discussion of national defense bonds and stamps at 8:15 over WBBM.

Smith and Editor Paul C. Smith of the San Francisco Chronicle will take part in an informal discussion on "Mr. Smith defines a Liberal" at 9:30 through WIBA. George V. Denny, America's Town Meeting moderator, will be chairman of the session, to be held at the Citizens Conference on Government Management in Estes Park, Colo.
