

Tyrone Power To Be Star Of "Arrowsmith" On Monday

Dramatization Of Powerful Sinclair Lewis Novel Scheduled Via WEAF At 7:30 P. M.; Boyer And Miss Loy Together

Handsome Tyrone Power will star in a dramatization of Sinclair Lewis' powerful novel, "Arrowsmith," on the "Cavalcade of America" program Monday at 7:30 p. m. over WEAF.

Tyrone is to portray young Dr. Martin Arrowsmith who, at the crucial moment in his life, must decide whether he is a cold-hearted scientist or a man of normal emotions.

A cast of well-known Hollywood actors will support Tyrone in the dramatization of the book which won a Nobel prize for Sinclair Lewis.

Cecil B. DeMille will present Charles Boyer and Myrna Loy in a special adaptation of the film farce "Appointment for Love," on the Radio Theatre Monday at 9 p. m. over WABC. The Loy-Boyer team is new to the Lux Radio theatre, altho both have appeared individually on many occasions.

"Appointment for Love" is the story of two very engaging young people who had difficulty in adjusting their professional and private lives.

As his tribute to Washington's birthday, James Melton, the tenor star headlines an all-American music program on "The Telephone Hour" over WEAF Monday at 8 p. m., by singing Earl Robinson's famed "Ballad for Americans." He will be accompanied by Ken Christie's chorus and the Don Voorhees orchestra. Also to be heard on the program is George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue." Melton and Gershwin were great friends and once toured the country together. Additional singing on "The Telephone Hour" will be by Francis White, soprano, who offers Spring Songs of the Robin Woman from Cadman's "Shanewis."

In a program rich in romance, fantasy and sentiment, Margaret Speaks will sing "Connais-tu le Pays?" from Thomas' "Mignon" as her featured solo on "Voice of Firestone" Monday at 8:30 over WEAF.

The soprano also will be heard in Crist's "Some Day, Some Way," Kreisler's "You Are Free," and "Romany Life" by Victor Herbert. The orchestra under Alfred Wallenstein is to play the Overture to Flotow's "Martha," Lacombe's "Aubade Printaniere," and "Dance of the Cammorists" by Wolf-Ferrari.
