

# Boris Karloff Will Up "Inner Sanctum"

Spine-Tingler Scheduled Sunday  
ward Everett Horton Set For  
With Charlie McCarthy

Winding up his current series of guest appearances, Boris Karloff, kingpin of the horror men, will appear in "Study for Murder" during the "Inner Sanctum" series, starting Sunday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ.

Cast as a psychiatrist with a statistician's sets about finding out why roughly 80 percent of the most murders are committed by guys who have never jumped a lease or received a parking ticket. Absorbed in his research, Karloff becomes intrigued by the unusual motives for most of the crimes. The urge to kill grips him, too, and soon heads and bodies are bouncing all over the place.

Edward Everett Horton, veteran actor of the stage and screen, will drop in to parley with Charlie McCarthy on the show Sunday at 8 p. m. over WFAF.

The sweeping RAF raids on Western Europe is the "Story Behind the Headlines" Cesar Saerchinger has selected for his Sunday night discussion at 11:15 p. m. over WFAF. Under the auspices of the American Historical-assn, Saerchinger's weekly NBC broadcasts present the outstanding news story of the week in the light of historical analysis.

Gene Autry, singing cowboy star of radio, rodeo and the screen, brings his rodeo troupe to the "Show of Yesterday and Today," when it airs on Sunday at 2:30 p. m. on WJZ. Autry and his cowboys will broadcast from Philadelphia, where they are playing an engagement at the Uline Arena. Western music appropriate to the occasion will be played by Blue Baron and his "Music of Yesterday and Today," that portion of the program originating from Passaic, N. J., from where the show as a whole will emanate, under the direction of Alton Alexander. This broadcast also will feature a return engagement of Nick Democrazy, Greek dialect comedian introduced on the April 26 program. Nick learns to ride a horse in Sunday's comedy feature.

Hall Peary, better known as "Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve," started his radio career in San Francisco in 1925, when crystal set dialers heard him as the "Spanish Serenader."

On Sunday Peary returns to San Francisco as a star to join the parade of "home-towners" dedicating the new NBC Radio City there. On that date, "The Great Gildersleeve" program will originate in the "City by the Golden Gate," at 6:30 p. m. on WFAF.
