

# Tibbett Dedicates To Thanksgiving

## Monday Radio Also To Feature Law Welles To Give Vignette

Lawrence Tibbett, making his third "Telephone Hour" Great Artists series, program to Thanksgiving Monday, over WEAF, program opens with a selection which, altho more than four centuries old, is still appropriate. It is the "Hymn of Thanksgiving" by Kremser, a Dutch composer.

Donald Vorhees conducts the 57 piece-symphonic orchestra in an arrangement of Fritz Kreisler's "Tambourin Chinois" and Franz Lehar's "Gold and Silver Waltz." Final selection for the orchestra, Tibbett, and the Bell chorus will be the stirring song of praise and reverence, "Te Deum" from Puccini's Opera "Tosca."

Louis Bromfield, novelist, short story writer, Pulitzer prize winner, stars in his own play, "Feast From the Harvest," a Thanksgiving fantasy written especially for "Cavalcade of America," on Monday over WEAF at 8 p. m.

It is a drama of the people who tend the earth, based on Bromfield's novel "The Farm." It traces a sturdy pioneer family from its early westward trek to the present. Bromfield himself, owner of an 1100-acre Ohio farm and descendant of a pioneer farming family, is no stranger to the good earth. But in his free-form Cavalcade play he creates situations that occurred on no real farm; situations like the dead arising to control the events of today.

Margaret Speaks interrupts a schedule of war work, farming and guest appearances to be soloist in a concert Monday over WEAF at 8:30 p. m. EWT. Miss Speaks has selected "A House Love Built for You and Me" by Coates, Jerome Kern's "Dearly Beloved" and "Sing! Sing! Sing!" by John Sacco.

The gaiety, adventure and tragedy in the life of Vasco Nunez de Balboa are condensed in a "Lands of the Free" radio drama set for the weekly broadcast of Monday over WEAF at 10:30 p. m., EWT. "The Southern Sea," title of the play, is the name the Spanish explorer gave to the Pacific ocean when he discovered it in 1513 from an east-and-west stretch of shore on the Isthmus of Panama. He was the first European to see the great ocean from American shores.

Orson Welles will devote the third program of his "Celling Unlimited" series Nov. 23, to the Navigator over WABC at 7:15 p. m. EWT. The courage and ability of America's great navigators will be the subject of Welles' 15-minute vignette.

An American freighter, torpedoed in the South Atlantic will provide the background for "The Case of the Bogus Son" to be presented during the "Counter-spy" program, Monday at 9 p. m. over WJZ.

"The Gay Sisters," film version of the popular novel by Stephen Longstreet, will be presented by Cecil B. DeMille in a special Radio theatre adaptation, starring Barbara Stanwyck and Robert Young, Monday at 9 p. m. (EWT) over WABC.
