## "DOUBLE LIFE" IS ALL NEWS TO THIS MAN

INDIANAPOLIS, Sept 15 — (UP) — Federal agents questioned a man today who claimed it was all news to him that he has two wives, two names and an impatient draft board.

Ivan Willard Horn, alias Willard McDonald, 30, said the whole thing could be laid to amnesia.

He told U. S. Commissioner Howard Young that everything went black some time in 1941. He woke up sitting next to a strange man in an automobile in Florida, he said.

The stranger said Horn had left North Carolina because of "woman trouble" and gave Horn a sealed envelope marked "not to be opened until death." Horn said he observed the directions.

He moved from Florida to Indianapolis, became a streetcar motorman and was married. But his wife apparently was more curious that he. She talked him into opening the envelope.

The letter said he was not McDonald, but Horn, and that he had a wife in Cumberland-co, N. C., plus an interested draft board.

His new wife, anxious to learn if there really was another woman, left with the letter for North Carolina.

Then came federal agents with a warrant for Horn's arrest for draft evasion.
