DEDUCTIONS FOR BAD DEBTS

Worthless debts occurring in a trade or business and arising from unpaid wages, salaries, rents and similar items are not allowable deductions in computing Federal normal tax and surtax unless the amounts due have previously been included in income either in the year in which the deduction as a bad debt is sought to be made or for a previous year. Thus, uncollectible bills rendered by professional men such as physicians, lawyers, dentists, etc., are not deductible as bad debts unless the amount of such bills rendered has been included in the income re-
