

# Story Of Sgt. Bennett Presented On Cavalcade

A story of rehabilitation work performed by the Army Air Forces, as seen thru the eyes of an injured waist gunner, is the subject for "Cavalcade of America" Monday (WEAF, 7 p. m., EST).

Titled "The Doctor Gets an Answer," this is the tale of Sgt. Doug Bennett, waist gunner of a Flying Fortress that was shot down over Germany shortly before D-Day. It tells of Bennett's 'chute jump with his pal, who is shot from the air by an attacking Nazi plane. It relates Bennett's escape to France, where he is picked up by the British invasion forces and shipped back to England.

Wendell Willkie makes one of his infrequent radio appearances as a guest expert on "Information Please" when the program returns to the air Monday (9:30 p. m., EST). Alexander Knox, who played the title role in the film "Wilson," shares the spotlight as the second guest expert. Quizmaster Clifton Fadiman and Reg-

ulars Franklin P. Adams and John Kieran participate.
