STATES URGED TO BOOST PAY FOR JOBLESS

CHICAGO, Jan. 15—(AP)—The council of state governments recommended today that the 44 state legislatures meeting this year revise their unemployment compensation laws to bring benefit payments up to a maximum of \$20 a week for a maximum of 26 weeks.

The council's report on unemployment compensation in the post-war period said such maximums would sustain an adequate standard of living for workers and their families for a reasonable period of reconversion and minimize deflationary effects of unemployment.

A \$20 maximum now is provided in nine states, California, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Utah, Wisconsin, Wyoming and Connecticut; a \$15 maximum is provided in 21 states and \$18 in 14 states, the council reported.
