

Voice of Trudy Erwin Heard Over Bing Crosby Broadcast

Bing Crosby brings back a familiar voice to the Music Hall at 9 p. m. Thursday over NBC. None other than Trudy Erwin will make a guest appearance on the show.

Before she became a regular singing partner with Bing, she was one of the Music Maids on the program. Stepping from this to solos and duets with Crosby, she's gone on to greater heights in her singing career.

Tony Martin, who recently returned to civilian life after having served in both the Army and Navy in World War II, makes one of his first guest-star appearances when he visits the "Dinah Shore's Open House" show at 8:30 p. m. Thursday over NBC.

Dinah honors Tony's return to the microphone with several tunes, and Martin follows in the same pattern.
