## Blind Woman, 69, Runs House Unaided

LA FRANK, W. Va.—(U.P.)—Being totally blind does not keep Mrs. Lily Byrd Grimm, 69, from living a normal life, without outside assistance.

Mrs. Grimm, who has been blind for 26 years, takes care of her home, does her own laundry, cans fruits and vegetables, and is active in her church.

Much of her time is spent listening to a phonograph furnished free by the government, which sends her records telling of magazine articles, biographies of people in the news, and music. She can return the records postage-free to Washington and get a new set in return.

Mrs. Grimm has been living alone since her husband died four years ago.
