Oshkosh Farmer Accused of Burning Wife with Torch

OSHKOSH — (U.P.) — The state charged Tuesday afternoon that a 44-year-old farmer tied his wife with a clothesline and then burned her with a blowtorch and threatened her with a homemade gun.

Mrs. Martha Erickson, 42, was not seriously hurt. But her husband, Selmer, was wounded in the groin when the gun discharged accidentally. Sheriff's Lieut. Harry Krippner said.

Erickson, who was committed to a state mental hospital last year, was charged with assault with intent to do great bodily harm. He was held in jail under \$25,000 bail to await a hearing Friday.
