## 'Scoop Shovel Scotty' Reigns Over Hoboes

BRITT, Iowa, (UP)—"Scoop Shovel Scotty" was elected king of America's hoboes Wednesday as thousands of Iowans crowded this little town to do honor to the nation's bums.

It was a long-sought victory for "Scoop Shovel," who's been campaigning 18 years for the post.

About 20,000 persons poured into Britt, whose normal population is 3,000, to watch a two-hour parade. Afterwards they were served Mulligan stew, the traditional hobo's fare, from huge iron vats.

"Cannonball" Baker, the deposed hobo king, was not on hand to seek reelection from the tattered "delegates." However, Sylvia Davis, the reigning queen, was reinstated on her throne.
